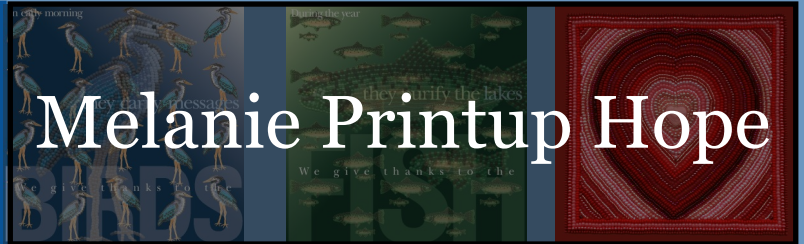

Melanie Printup Hope is of Tuscarora and European descent and was raised on the Tuscarora Indian Reservation in Western New York State. An award winning and acclaimed artist, her talk will discuss her linking of traditional Indigenous forms like beadwork with electronic arts. She has exhibited her work across North America. She is an Associate Professor at OCAD University in Toronto, Ontario, Canada and an Associate Professor Emerita at The Sage Colleges, Albany and Troy, New York.
