## George Orton

Orton was the first Canadian to win a medal at the Olympic ames. He competed in 1900, winning a gold in the 2500 m 400 m hurdles.


George Hodgson
Hodgson was Canada's first double gold Olympic medalist. He arned two golds in swimming 400 m and 1500 m ) and set world records in both events.


Ethel Catherwood
Catherwood was one of the firs women to compete for Canada in the Olympics. She captured gold in high jump in 1928.
