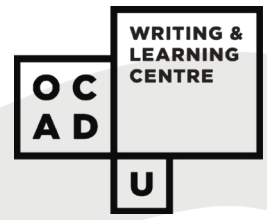


CALL FOR PROPOSALS: THE MIGHTY PEN STUDENT INITIATIVE FUND

Your application will be juried by a committee of OCAD U staff from the Writing & Learning Centre (WLC) and the Office of Diversity, Equity and Sustainability Initiatives (ODESI), who will evaluate your proposal based on the following criteria:

1. Relevance and Impact
 - Does your project fit under the mandate and vision of The Mighty Pen?
 - Does your project impact OCAD U students and the wider community?
 - How does your project build skills, support student resilience and feature BIPOC voices, experiences and stories?
2. Equity and Diversity
 - How well does your project promote anti-racism and anti-discrimination within OCAD U?
 - How well does your project address or remove systemic barriers for students?
3. Feasibility
 - What is your experience doing similar events and are you collaborating with other individuals, student and/or community groups?
 - What is your timeline, and can your project be delivered in the time proposed?
 - Is your budget feasible? Have you located other sources of funding/revenue?
